

Club Competitions 2009/10 Monthly Update – July & August



Introduction

Welcome to the third monthly update on the 2009/10 Club Competitions. Monthly or bimonthly updates will hopefully be added to the club website in the first week of the following calendar month. However, the update is reliant on the publication of official results, so could be slightly delayed if they are not promptly available. Each update will provide a commentary on the results and the scoring for the nominated club races.

All calculations and commentary are drawn from information contained on the club website. So please ensure that Martin has all the correct details including whether you achieved a course or personal best. The rules and explanations for all three competitions along with a full archive of last year's competitions are also shown on the website.

July's Races

There are five nominated races in July and August and details of the scoring in each event are detailed below.

Collingwood fielded three full teams in the Nonsuch Park Relay Race run by David Denton. Nicola, Steve, Andy and Martin finished 19th overall. Ray, Ruth, Graham and Annette were 40th. Kate, Gill, Stuart and Dave finished 60th.

Steve was the fastest member overall taking the 40 points in the Club Championship from Andy in 2nd place and Ray in 3rd.

The Age-graded competition threw up a third different winner with Andy heading Steve and Martin. Martin was 3rd from Nicola by just 0.01%; could Nicola have run just a second quicker?

The Handicap Competition was a little unusual with eight members running the Elmore 7 for the first time and therefore 'scratch' runners. Only Rob, Doug and Andy were returning to the event and Andy's PB secured top points, but only just from Doug.

Bill produced another personal best on a challenging 5km course, so going under 20 minutes and over 70% was an excellent result.

Ruth was the only member to improve her handicap time and therefore took the top points in the Handicap Competition.

Standings

Keith remains well on the way to retaining his title, already equalling his 399 points from last year. Bill and Andy swapped places from May to June and swapped back again by the end of August. So far only three men have a full championship score.

Nicola moves up from 3rd place to 1st, with Ruth dropping to 2nd. Kate drops out of the first three replaced by Annette. These are the only four women to have a full championship score.

Overall seven members have a championship score so far, compared to just two at the same time last year.

Last year the top scores in the Handicap Competition were only 77 and 43 points at the end of August. The winning scores at the end of the year were 135 for the men and 93 for the women, so it is likely that this year's winners will have to score considerably more to take the titles. Nicola is already ahead of Kate's winning points total for last year.

In the men's Handicap Competition the top three places remain the same as in June. Keith's strong start to the year means that he still has a comfortable lead over last year's runner-up Andy, who has closed the gap to only four points. Bill is close behind in 3rd place.

The women's competition is close, with Nicola moving up from 3^{rd} , Ruth staying in 2^{nd} and Kate dropping to 3^{rd} .

Last year the top scores in the Age-Graded Competition were only 72 and 42 points at the end of August. The winning scores at the end of the year were 181 for the men and 64 for the women, so it is likely that this year's winners will have to score considerably more to take the titles. Nicola already has 50% more points than she achieved in the whole of 2008/9.

For the men, Keith remains comfortably in the lead. Bill and Andy closed the gap this month. Nicola and Ruth stay in 1st and 2nd places with Nicola having a narrow 5 point lead. Annette remains 3rd.

September's Races

There are two nominated races in September, as follows:

All September marathons count separately for the Handicap and Age-Graded competitions, but only the best time counts for the Club Championship.
