

Club Competitions 2009/10 Monthly Update September & October



Introduction

Welcome to the fourth monthly update on the 2009/10 Club Competitions. Monthly or bimonthly updates will hopefully be added to the club website in the first week of the following calendar month. However, the update is reliant on the publication of official results, so could be slightly delayed if they are not promptly available. Each update will provide a commentary on the results and the scoring for the nominated club races.

All calculations and commentary are drawn from information contained on the club website. So please ensure that Martin has all the correct details including whether you achieved a course or personal best. The rules and explanations for all three competitions along with a full archive of last year's competitions are also shown on the website.

September's Races

There were just two nominated races in September; the first was in fact any September marathon.

All September marathons count separately for the Handicap and Age-Graded Competitions, but only the best time counts for the Club Championship. For the Handicap Competition, road marathons are considered against previous road marathon times and off-road marathons are considered against previous off-road marathons.

The second nominated race was the Croydon Switchback 5.

The first marathon of the four September marathons run by members was the Kent Coastal Marathon in Margate.

Andy was the fastest, but tied for first place with Martin in the Age-Graded Competition, with their percentages being the same to two decimal places. Six other members went above the 60% or local-level rating.

Kate achieved a Personal Best, with Ray and Gill debuting over the distance.

Standings

These are the leading places in the three competitions at the end of October. 32 members have scored points so far this year, up 8 on last year at this stage.

Keith remains well on the way to retaining his title, already equalling his 399 points from last year, but having not scored points since the Dysart Dash. Bill and Andy both closed the gap on Keith, but remain 2 points apart. So far only five men have a full championship score, with Doug now being the fourth and Martin fifth.

The first three places stay the same in the ladies competition, with Nicola, Ruth and Annette all scoring good points. There are the only four women with a full championship score, the fourth being Kate Knight.

Overall 9 members have a championship score so far, compared to just 4 at the same time last year.

There has been a big change in the men's Club Handicap, with Andy scoring good points during the last two months to move clear into first place, with Bill closing up in third.

The women's competition is close, with Nicola staying ahead of Ruth in 2nd and Kate in 3rd.

Last year the top scores in the Handicap Competition were only 84 and 43 points at the end of October. The winning scores at the end of the year were 135 for the men and 93 for the women, so it is likely that this year's winners will have to score considerably more to take the titles. Nicola is already ahead of Kate's winning points total for last year.

Andy moved from 3rd to 2nd in a very tight title race, with Bill only one points ahead, having moved up from 2nd.

Nicola and Ruth stay in 1st and 2nd places with Nicola having a narrow 7 point lead. Annette remains 3rd.

Last year the top scores in the Age-Graded Competition were only 92 and 42 points at the end of October. The winning scores at the end of the year were 181 for the men and 64 for the women, so it is likely that this year's winners will have to score considerably more to take the titles.
